of funding maintenance at the former Cotuit Elementary School, located at 140 Old

Oyster Road, Cotuit, MA.

BACKGROUND: At their November 20, 2019 meeting, the Barnstable School Committee voted unanimously to declare that the former Cotuit Elementary School building, located at 140 Old Oyster Road, Cotuit, Massachusetts, is no longer needed for educational purposes and that the custody and control of said property shall revert to the Town of Barnstable.

ANALYSIS: In order for the Town to maintain the former school and grounds in a manner that protects the asset prior to a decision on the building's eventual disposition, the Department of Public Works requires additional funding in FY 2020 for heating fuel, electricity, water, alarm services, etc.

FISCAL IMPACT: Funding for this appropriation will be provided from the General Fund reserves which has been certified by the State Department of Revenue to have a balance of \$14,688,744.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: Mark S. Ells, Town Manager recommends approval of this supplemental appropriation request.

BACKGROUND: The Town Council voted and approved the Capital Improvement Project for refurbishing the five compactor units that accept municipal solid waste at the Transfer Station & Recycling Center. The costs associated with the project at the time of approval showed the funding was sufficient to complete the related work.

ANALYSIS: Operation and maintenance of the of the compactor units is essential to the operation of the Transfer Station & Recycling Center. Preventive maintenance prolongs the life of necessary equipment but cannot prevent normal wear and tear. After more than 20 years of use, basic preventive maintenance is not sufficient for continued operation. Refurbishment and replacement of internal parts is required to continue use of the compactors. The cost of the materials needed to perform this work has increased since the approval of the project. This increase has resulted in project bids exceeding the appropriated funding. Using remaining Fiscal Year 2020 Capital Improvement funds from another project will allow the Solid Waste Division to complete work necessary for the efficient operation of the facility for users. Transfer of funds will cover the unexpected increase of costs to refurbish and repair the compactor units and avoid any delays that may result in equipment failure.

FISCAL IMPACT: Capital Improvement Project #2019-141 Roll Off Trailer Replacement has been completed and remaining funds of \$20,513 are due to be returned to Solid Waste Division Reserves. Instead, we are proposing that the remaining funds be redirected to project #2019-139 in order to complete the refurbishment of 5 compactor units. There is no operational budget impact.

TOWN MANAGER RECOMMENDATION: Mark S. Ells, Town Manager recommends approval of the transfer order.

BACKGROUND: The Department of Public Works is seeking approval from the Town Council through the Town Manager for \$169,266 in Community Preservation Historic Preservation funds. At the September 16, 2019 Community Preservation Committee meeting, the seven members present voted 6 yes and 1 no for recommendation to the Town Council through the Town Manager, the Department of Public Work's request for additional Historic Preservation funds in the amount of \$169,266 for replacement of failed metal replacement windows with historic wood replicated windows at the West Barnstable Community Building.

ANALYSIS This additional funding request is necessary because all bids received for the project exceeded the \$158,730 Historic Preservation funds previously appropriated under Town Council Order 2016-114. The total project budget amount of \$327,996 for window replacement includes contingencies, and will allow the project to be awarded to the lowest bidder. Replacement of the windows will complete the extensive upgrades that have been performed on the Community Building over the years. The West Barnstable Community Building is a public building built in 1903 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places and is located in the West Barnstable Village Historic and Old King's Highway Historic Districts.

FISCAL IMPACT: This appropriation is provided from the set-aside for historic preservation funds within the Community Preservation Fund which has an available balance of \$258,177. There is no impact on the general fund operating budget.
