2022-034 AMENDING THE CODE OF THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE, PART I, GENERAL ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 240 ZONING BY EXPANDING THE GROUND-MOUNTED SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC OVERLAY DISTRICT TO INCLUDE THE PROPERTY LOCATED AT 810 WAKEBY ROAD, MARSTONS MILLS (ASSESSORS' MAP 013 PARCELS 004, 005, 052) AND BY REQUIRING A SPECIAL PERMIT FOR LARGE-SCALE GROUND-MOUNTED SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC INSTALLATIONS LOCATED WTIHIN ANY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT LOCATED WITHIN THE OVERLAY DISTRICT

ORDERED: That the Code of the Town of Barnstable, Part I General Ordinances, Chapter 240 Zoning be amended as follows:

SECTION 1

That Chapter 240, Article II, Section 6, The Zoning Map of the Town of Barnstable Massachusetts is hereby amended to expand the Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District to include the parcels shown on Assessors' Map 013 as Parcels 004, 005, and 052 as shown on the maps entitled;

- "Proposed Amendment to the Town Zoning Map Expanding the Ground Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District In Marstons Mills"
- "Proposed Amendment to the Marstons Mills Zoning Map expanding the Ground Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District In Marstons Mills"

Each dated October 1, 2021, as prepared by the Town of Barnstable Geographical Information System (GIS) Unit.

SECTION 2

 By amending the definition of AS-OF-RIGHT-SITING in Section D of Article V, Section 240-44.2, Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District, by deleting the first sentence and inserting the following new sentence in place thereof:

"The ground-mounted solar photovoltaic installation may proceed without the need for a special permit, variance, amendment, waiver or other local discretionary approval, except that a special permit shall be required when located in a residential zoning district."

(2) By inserting the following definition of **HAZARDOUS PRODUCT** in said Section D immediately after the definition of **GROUND-MOUNTED SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC INSTALLATION**: **"HAZARDOUS PRODUCT**

Any chemical or combination of chemicals which, in any form, is listed by trade name, chemical name, formula or otherwise as a product which is a hazard to public drinking water supplies if concentrations beyond a certain level are achieved therein. 'Hazardous product' shall also include any product for which there is any listing, declaration, or announcement in any form issued by the

Unites States Environmental Agency, the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection, or by any other government agency having direct or indirect jurisdiction over public water supplies that such product is such a hazard or is a product known as an "emerging contaminant" suspected as being capable of being a carcinogen."

SECTION 3

By amending Subsection (1) of Section E of Article V, Section 240-44.2 by adding the following sentence to the end of such subsection:

"Any ground-mounted, large-scale solar photovoltaic installation with 250 kw or larger of rated nameplate capacity located in a residential zoning district shall also be required to obtain a special permit from the Planning Board in accordance with Subsection (3)."

SECTION 4

By further amending Section E of Article V, Section 240-44.2 by adding the following new Subsection (3):

(3) Special Permit Provisions.

A Special Permit shall be granted by the Planning Board if the Planning Board determines the following criteria have been met.

- (a) Site Plan Approval in accordance with subsections (1) and (2).
- (b) Adequate measures to contain and suppress noise and sound as deemed appropriate by the Planning Board, including, but not limited to, minimum 75-foot setback from all residential abutter property lines to the Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Installation.
- (c) Vegetative and/or hardscape screening with coniferous planting and earth berms of sufficient height, as determined by the Building Commissioner, to screen adjoining residential properties from the Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Installation.
- (d) Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) approval of Solar Glare Study, if such a study is deemed necessary by the FAA.
- (e) Cape Cod Commission approval as required.
- (f) Full disclosure of all hazardous products proposed to be used at any time at a project site shall be provided in writing to the Planning Board with the Special Permit application; no application for a special permit shall be considered complete until such disclosure is submitted to the Planning Board. No such hazardous materials shall be deployed or used at any time at a project site without approval of the Special Permit by the Planning Board.
- (g) Use, storage and containment of hazardous materials shall comply with all Federal, State, Regional, and local codes and regulations, including building, fire, and health codes.
- (h) Compliance with any other criteria found by the Planning Board as necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare, which may include, without limitation, the revocation of any prior permits and previous uses that benefit the project site."

SECTION 5

By amending Section I of Article V, Section 240-44.2 by deleting Section I in its entirety and inserting the following new Section I in its place:

"I. Dimensional requirements. Ground-mounted solar photovoltaic installations are subject to the front, side and rear yard setbacks as set forth in the underlying zoning district(s), except that any ground-mounted, large-scale solar photovoltaic installation with 250 kw or larger of rated nameplate capacity located in a residential zoning district shall maintain a minimum 75-foot setback from all abutting residential property lines to contain noise as sound, as required by Subsection (3) (b)."

SECTION 6

By amending Section L of Article V, Section 240-44.2 by adding the following subsections after subsection 2(c):

- (3) Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) approval of Solar Glare Study is required, if such a Study is deemed necessary by the FAA.
- (4) The project proponent shall provide full disclosure of all hazardous products proposed to be used at any time at a project site shall be provided in writing to the Building Commissioner with the Site Plan Review application; no application for Site Plan Review shall be considered complete until such disclosure is submitted to the Building Commissioner. No such hazardous materials shall be deployed or used at any time at a project site without Site Plan approval.
- (5) Use, storage and containment of hazardous materials shall comply with all Federal, State, Regional, and local codes and regulations, including building, fire, and health codes.
- (6) The project shall demonstrate compliance with any other criteria found by the Building Commissioner as necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare, which may include, without limitation, the revocation of any prior permits and previous uses that benefit the project site."

BACKGROUND: Since 1975, Section 3 of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 40A, the state Zoning Act, has allowed solar projects as of right in all zoning districts, subject only to regulations to protect public health, safety, and welfare. It reads:

No zoning ordinance or by-law shall prohibit or unreasonably regulate the installation of solar energy systems or the building of structures that facilitate the collection of solar energy, except where necessary to protect the public health, safety or welfare.

In 2010, pursuant to the state Green Communities Act, the Town created a Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District (Section 240-44.2 of the Town Code), which governs where large-scale solar projects may be constructed in the Town.


PROPOSED ZONING AMENDMENT: TJA Clean Energy is now seeking to construct a solar energy project at 810 Wakeby Road in a residential district that is not within the Ground-Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District. TJA claims that the Town's Overlay District is unduly restrictive and not in compliance with M.G.L Chapter 40A and has filed a lawsuit seeking a permanent injunction ordering the Town to issue a building permit to TJA for the project. A similar lawsuit involving the Town of Waltham resulted in a decision by the Land Court that the Town of Waltham was not in compliance with M.G.L Chapter 40A, and that case is now pending in the Appeals Court.


To resolve the lawsuit involving TJA's proposed project, a zoning amendment is proposed, narrowly tailored to apply only to the three parcels at 810 Wakeby Road. The proposed zoning amendment creates a special permit process that would allow the TJA project to proceed after ensuring that public health, safety and welfare issues are addressed. Under the proposed zoning amendment, the Planning Board would be designated as the body to administer the special permit process in order to provide for public notice and input on these issues. For TJA to receive a special permit, it would have to meet specified criteria, including the revocation of all other existing permits for the property. The proposed zoning amendment identifies a number of issues that TJA must address in public before the Planning Board and standards that it must meet. If TJA is able to meet all of those standards, as determined by the Planning Board, it would be entitled to receive a special permit.


FISCAL IMPACT: The proposed zoning amendment, if adopted, would avoid protracted litigation and expense.

BACKGROUND: Section 5 of M.G.L. c. 40A, the state Zoning Act, provides that "[a]doption or change of zoning ordinances or by-laws may be initiated by the submission to the city council ... of a proposed zoning ordinance ... by ten registered voters in a city ..." Section 5 further provides that the City Council "shall within fourteen days of receipt of such zoning ordinance ... submit it to the planning board for review."

On February 3, 2022, a resident of the Town submitted a proposed amendment to the Town's zoning ordinance to the Town Clerk, along with the signatures of ten residents of the Town. On February 7, 2022, the Town Clerk certified that the petition was signed by ten certified voters of the Town. On February 9, 2022, the petition was submitted to the Town Council by one of the proponents of the petition. In accordance with G.L. c. 40A, section 5, the proposed amendment has been placed on this meeting's agenda for referral to the Planning Board.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact.

We, the undersigned voters of the Town of Barnstable, request the following article be placed on the agenda of the Barnstable Town Council meeting pursuant to G.L. Ch. 40A, Sec. 5:

To see if the Town of Barnstable will amend the Town's Zoning Ordinance by adding a new section as follows:

Title: Temporary Moratorium on the Construction of Large Scale Ground Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Systems, that would provide as follows:

a) Purpose

The Town of Barnstable has a uniquely fragile sole source aquifer as identified by the United States Environmental Protection Agency and the Massachusetts Department of Environmental Protection. Industrial scale ground mounted photovoltaic solar systems pose a serious threat to this public water source and may have damaging effects on our ecology and therefore our economy.

The Town is being coerced through litigation to approve an amendment to its zoning ordinance to benefit a single property with the right to build an industrial scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic system in a residentially zoned district zone, threatening the safety and welfare of residents as well as the adjoining wellhead protection, conservation restriction land of the Centerville, Osterville, Marstons Mills Water District.

There is an urgent community need to establish long-term zoning ordinance provisions to ensure that such uses and development will be consistent with the Town's long term planning interests and the health, safety and welfare of its citizens. It is crucial that the Town establish a temporary moratorium on the use of land and the construction of structures related to such large scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic systems, structures, the issuance of permits in connection with same, and the amendment of zoning of residentially zoned properties in connection with same.

b) Moratorium

No building permit, special permit or site plan approval decision may be issued in connection to or for the construction of any large scale ground mounted solar photovoltaic system in size of more than 150% of the documented average use of a residential, commercial, business, municipal or agricultural application for any property for which such system is proposed, and not to exceed 35 kilowatts, for 11.5 months after the approval of said moratorium, or until sufficient deliberations

by the Town have been completed for the determination of its bylaws pertaining to such. No Ground Mounted Solar Photovoltaic Overlay District (GMSPVOD) may be adopted or imposed over a residential zone for 11.5 months after the approval of said moratorium, or until sufficient deliberations by the Town have been completed for the determination of its bylaws pertaining to such. The purpose of this moratorium is to allow sufficient time to engage in a planning process to address the effects of such structures and uses in the Town and to enact bylaws in a manner consistent with sound land use, planning goals and objectives, or take any action related thereto.

BACKGROUND: The General Fund Municipal Operations of the Town of Barnstable are projected to collectively produce over \$900,000 in salary budget savings due to numerous retirements and resignations throughout Fiscal Year 2022. The Golf Enterprise Fund is projected to generate in excess of \$100,000 in salary savings as well. As a result, it presents an opportunity to utilize some of these funds to procure outside professional assistance, equipment, supplies and materials that were not included in the original Fiscal Year 2022 budget or the proposed Fiscal Year 2023 budget. In addition, due to several retirements and vacancies in the Barnstable Police Department throughout the year, minimum staffing requirements have resulted in the department incurring additional overtime costs to fill shifts necessitating the need for a budget transfer to cover this cost.

BACKGROUND: M.G.L. c. 30B, § 12(b) provides that a procurement officer may not award a contract for a term exceeding three years, including any renewal, extension or option, unless authorized by majority vote of the Town Council. The current lease agreements for the Olde Barnstable Fairgrounds Golf Course and Hyannis Golf Course are set to expire in the spring of 2023. Quotes were solicited using State Contract FAC116 from all eligible vendors approved to lease equipment for 143 golf cars and 17 utility vehicles for both three and five year lease terms.

New England Golf Cars, Inc. provided the only quote for both three and five year options. This quote was reviewed and found to be responsive, responsible and eligible.

It is advantageous for the Golf Division to enter into one lease for both locations with a five year term to provide significant cost savings.

FISCAL IMPACT: The annual cost for the three year option is \$178,135. The annual cost for the five year option is \$145,580. With the recommended five year agreement, the Town will save \$32,555 annually over the first three years.

That the Town Manager submit a petition to the General Court of the Commonwealth for a special act approving the grant of an easement to Park City Wind LLC, as follows.

AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE TOWN OF BARNSTABLE TO GRANT AN EASEMENT TO PARK CITY WIND LLC

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same as follows:

SECTION 1: The Town Council of the city known as the Town of Barnstable may grant an easement to Park City Wind LLC, and its successors and assigns, in parcels of land, namely a portion of Craigville Beach known as Assessors' Parcel 206-013 and a portion of 20 South Main Street known as Assessors' Parcel 228-138, for the purpose of constructing, installing, inspecting, operating, maintaining, repairing and replacing, subsurface high voltage electric power transmission lines, along with associated subsurface appurtenances including but not limited to subsurface telecommunications lines, conduits, duct banks, bays and vaults, and together with surface appurtenances for access, in connection with the wind generating facility to be developed by Park City Wind LLC in federal waters south of Martha's Vineyard; provided, however, that Park City Wind LLC shall provide mitigation for the granting of such an easement pursuant to the Host Community Agreement entered into between the city known as the town of Barnstable and Park City Wind LLC.

SECTION 2: The Town Manager of the city known as the Town of Barnstable may execute and record any instruments necessary on behalf of the city known as the Town of Barnstable to effectuate the section 1 upon the passage of this act.

SECTION 3: This act shall take effect upon its passage.

RATIONALE: various votes in support of implementation of Park City Wind LLC and Town of Barnstable Host Community Agreement

The Town and Park City Wind entered into a Host Community Agreement on May 19, 2022 in support of the second phase of bringing offshore renewable energy through the Town and connecting to the regional electric grid. Five Council votes are currently needed to begin implementation of the project.

- 1. A change of purpose approval to allow Park City to bring electrical conduits under Craigville Beach and associated roadways and thereby share the general municipal use to which Craigville Beach has been dedicated.
- 2. An authorization to allow the Town Manager to petition the State Legislature for authority to grant the needed easements under Craigville Beach to Park City Wind.
- 3. Upon Legislative Approval to do so, approving the grant of easement under Craigville Beach and a portion of 20 South Main Street for installation of underground cables.
- 4. Authorizing the Town Manager to execute a utility easement from Craigville Beach to Shootflying Hill Road.
- 5. Authorizing Park City Wind to record a Chapter 91 License and other state licenses for this project at the Barnstable County Registry of Deeds.

The Host Community Agreement contemplates the need for Town support on matters such as granting of easements, etc. These votes will advance the project in a timely way and are consistent with the Town's obligations under the Host Community Agreement.
