

Town Council Meeting June 16, 2022



A quorum being duly present, President Matthew Levesque called the June 16, 2022, Town Council meeting to order at 7:06 PM.

Councilor questions and comments:

(Starr) Do I understand we are going to have three different workshops and are they going to be during the summer meetings? (Ells) Workshops allows for a productive back and forth, providing expertise for the Council, the date and timing will be through the Council Leadership (Levesque) Public roads will be coming up in one of the next few meetings; with the sewering going forward we need access to the roads involved; (Starr) my preference would be in-person meetings (Levesque) no ability as yet to stay in remote meetings awaiting a decision from the legislature. (Ells) We haven't been taking private roads for a long time now, we have had a private roads program; we need to have a policy. (Starr) Cape Cod and Islands Water Protection Fund (CCIWPF) is using the rental taxes will that also cover water filtration programs (Ells) no. (Mendes) Some private roads that have very high traffic need repairs they should be taken as a public road.

Dan Santos, Director of Public Works provided an update on the Water Resources
 Management including the Comprehensive Wastewater Management Plan (CWMP)
 utilizing a power point presentation

Councilor questions and comments:

(Ells) urges everyone to take a look at what the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is doing, the new level of proposed testing-can you detect per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFOS/PFAS); this is going to be a real challenge; (Starr) Pretty jarring, we don't have testing equipment for PFOS,(Santos) They are testing a variety of them, going to need to advise the users of the risk of consuming water with these compounds; (Starr) rates are going to double in Barnstable Village (Ells) chasing the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds as we meet the criteria, working on access to the County ARPA funds; can the town set up a portal for additional funding sources (Starr) Kudos for starting the process (Hebert) Complimented the crews that have been working on the sewer, better communication, where do we stand with Stewarts Creek and getting all those folks on the sewer system (Santos) Still quite a few that are not connected; will check with the Board of Health to get that number for you (Hebert) all the green lawns; we need to educate the public on the cost to the environment (Mendes) What are the per gallon per minute in the Hyannis Water District (Santos) about 200 gallons per day (Cullum) It is essential that we are all on board at the same time regarding (Stewarts Creek).
